I am a civil rights lawyer working on a case about Arizona's voter registration system. The court has allowed me to write to you in connection with this case and your personal information is not being shared with the public. Any information that you provide to me in response to this letter will be kept confidential pursuant to a court order.

Your voter registration application was rejected under an Arizona law called Proposition 200. We have filed a lawsuit against this law because we believe Proposition 200 blocks U.S. citizens from registering to vote. It also can force people to register twice when they don't include extra paperwork the first time they register.

The right to vote is one of the most important rights in our country. As a U.S. citizen, you have the right to vote equal to all other citizens. It is the goal of the lawsuit to make sure that Arizona accepts voter registration applications from eligible people.

I would like to speak with you to learn more about your experience trying to register to vote in Arizona. My organization works on this case without charging any fees. I am only contacting you for information.

Please feel free to respond to me at the toll free phone number or email address provided below. Your assistance is greatly appreciated, but you are not required to provide any information to me. As I mentioned above, any information you share with me will be kept confidential and if you give me permission to share any information with the Court, it will be protected and not shared with the public. I am very concerned that someone seems to have her personal information or is attempting to get more of her information. Elizabeth is 19 years old and has voted several times, most recently in the primary election for President. This Nicholas Espiritu was very rude and insisted several times that they had the right to receive this information and that the information came from your office in the form of a "list" of people who had been denied voter registration in Arizona. Elizabeth is a natural born American, I am 43 years old and have always lived in the U.S. and have voted in every election since I turned 18. This is very alarming. Please let me know what if anything we need to do to protect Elizabeth and her personal information. You may contact me at any time at the above phone number.
