DECLARATION OF MARK W. DELAQUIL

I, Mark W. DeLaquil, declare as follows:

1. I make this declaration in support of a petition for attorneys' fees and expenses pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1988 covering the hours that have been thus far expended in this matter, beginning on June 20, 2016 through our work on July 12, 2016. Included in this declaration is my testimony concerning hours expended and costs incurred by myself, my partners, David B. Rivkin, Jr. and Andrew M. Grossman, our associates, Richard B. Raile and Joseph T. Nawrocki, and paraprofessional Asef ("Ricky") Dyer in representing the Plaintiff in this case, as well as information regarding our training, background, and experience.

2. I am a partner at the law firm Baker Hostetler LLP ("Baker Hostetler" or the "Firm") and counsel of record in this action. I graduated *cum laude* from Harvard Law School in 2004 and have 12 years of constitutional litigation experience, including litigation involving the Section 1983 Civil Rights Action and the First Amendment. I am rated AV Preeminent by Martindale-Hubbell and was recognized as a Washington, D.C. Super Lawyer "Rising Star" in 2014. I have represented clients in many campaign finance matters and have obtained preliminary injunctions enjoining the enforcement of a state law requiring certain social welfare organizations to register as political committees and the enforcement of a state law barring coordination between candidates and unaffiliated organizations concerning issues advocacy. I have also represented parties in appeals throughout the United States and *amici curiae* in proceedings before the U.S. Supreme Court and nearly all of the United States Courts of Appeals. I have been licensed to practice law in Virginia for 12 years and have been admitted to the bar of this Court for 10 years. I am also authorized to practice law in the District of Columbia, in the United States District Courts for the Eastern District of Wisconsin, and the U.S.

Courts of Appeals for the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Seventh, Eighth, Ninth, and D.C. Circuits. My firm website bio is attached in **Exhibit A**.

3. Baker Hostetler has served as counsel to Plaintiff Carroll Boston Correll, Jr. (“Mr. Correll”) throughout the litigation of this case. Attached as **Exhibit B** is a detailed listing of all the fees requested for Baker Hostetler in this case. This exhibit discloses (a) the date work was performed, (b) the lawyer or paraprofessional performing such work, (c) an explanation of the work performed, (d) the amount of time actually spent on such work, and (if deductions on bill) the amount of time deducted for the reasons discussed in Paragraph 7, *infra*. At the end of the chart is a table summarizing the time totals and fees sought.

4. Though we are permitted by the Supreme Court to charge the hourly rates for the time requested according to Baker Hostetler’s currently prevailing rates, *Missouri v. Jenkins*, 491 U.S. 274 (1999), we are requesting reimbursement at discounted rates.

5. The total amount of fees incurred at discounted rates for all work involved is approximately \$265,190. Due to our reduction in hours as explained below, we are asking for total fees in the amount of \$240,831.25. This is a reduction of over 9 percent.

6. The fees sought include only those amounts incurred through July 12, 2016, the day after the Court’s decision. Fees incurred after July 12, 2016—including fees associated with this fee petition and post-trial motions, if any—will be submitted in a supplemental petition, as instructed by the Court and in keeping with customary practice. *See, e.g., Trimper v. City of Norfolk*, 58 F.3d 68, 77 (4th Cir. 1995) (recognizing that time spent defending entitlement to attorney’s fees is properly compensable under § 1988).

7. The time for which fees are sought in this petition have been reduced from the total time expended in this case. Although 548.25 total hours were expended, fees for 57 hours are not being sought because I conclude that they were not appropriately the subject of a fee award under Section 1988. The individual reductions are listed in **Exhibit B**.

8. As counsel of record in this case, I made my best efforts to have work performed by persons in the Firm who are competent and capable of performing work efficiently at the most reasonable hourly rates.

9. My partner David B. Rivkin, Jr., worked with me on this matter. Mr. Rivkin graduated from the Columbia University School of Law in 1985 and has 31 years of legal experience in constitutional law and litigation, including in the White House Counsel’s Office and the Department of Justice. He has served as lead counsel in significant constitutional litigation matters before, such as *Lebron v. Rumsfeld*, 670 F.3d 540 (4th Cir. 2012), and *Florida ex rel. Bondi v. United States Department of Health and Human Services*, 780 F. Supp. 2d 1256 (N.D. Fla. 2011). He was also awarded a Burton Award for Legal Achievement by the Burton Foundation and the Law Library of Congress in 2011.

10. Mr. Rivkin also has significant experience with civil rights litigation. For example, he has been lead counsel in multiple Section 1983 Civil Rights Actions brought against Wisconsin state government officials relating to a criminal investigation of conservative and right-of-center policy advocacy groups. He has been lead counsel in other actions challenging

campaign finance and election law issues in Wisconsin and Texas. Further, Mr. Rivkin has significant experience defending government officials in *Bivens* actions, including serving as lead counsel for former Secretary of Defense Donald Rumsfeld.

11. Mr. Rivkin is authorized to practice law in the United States District Courts for the Eastern District of Wisconsin, the Northern District of Florida, the District of South Carolina, the U.S. Courts of Appeals for the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Seventh, Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh, and D.C. Circuits, and the Supreme Court of the United States. Mr. Rivkin has been recognized as a Washington, D.C. “Super Lawyer” in 2007, 2008, 2014, 2015, and 2016.

12. Mr. Rivkin led the team in crafting litigation strategy, overseeing the drafting of motions, interfacing with the client, and making closing arguments at the July 7, 2016 trial. Mr. Rivkin’s firm website bio is attached in **Exhibit A**.

13. My partner Andrew Grossman also worked with me on this matter. Mr. Grossman graduated *magna cum laude* from George Mason University School of Law in 2007 and clerked for Chief Judge Edith H. Jones of the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit. He has nine years of experience in constitutional litigation, including numerous cases involving the First Amendment and the Section 1983 Civil Rights Action. He has also represented Senators John McCain, Lindsey Graham, and Kelly Ayotte in Second Circuit litigation challenging the constitutionality of the military detention-related provisions contained in the National Defense Authorization Act. He was awarded a Burton Award for Legal Achievement by the Burton Foundation and the Law Library of Congress in 2007. Mr. Grossman is licensed to practice law in the District of Columbia and in the U.S. Courts of Appeals for the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Seventh, Ninth, Eleventh, and D.C. Circuits, the U.S. Tax Court, and the U.S. Supreme Court. Mr. Grossman has been recognized as a Washington, D.C. Super Lawyer “Rising Star” in 2014, 2015, and 2016.

14. Mr. Grossman took the lead in drafting the complaint and motions, and contributed significantly to the development of litigation strategy. Mr. Grossman’s firm website bio is attached in **Exhibit A**.

15. Associates in the Firm were assigned research tasks and other litigation matters appropriate for their experience, skill, and hourly rates. Associate Richard Raile provided factual and legal research and oversaw the drafting of certain pleadings, including the proposed joint stipulation of facts. Mr. Raile graduated *magna cum laude* from University of Minnesota School of Law in 2012 and has 4 years of litigation experience, including litigation involving the Section 1983 Civil Rights Action, election law, and the First Amendment. Associate Joseph Nawrocki contributed factual and legal research, assisted in the drafting of the joint stipulation of facts, and assisted with finalizing filings. Mr. Nawrocki has also provided factual and legal research and prepared the application for fees that is filed with this Declaration. Mr. Nawrocki graduated from Yale Law School in 2015 where he served on the *Yale Law Journal*. He has one year of litigation experience. The firm website bios of Mr. Raile and Mr. Nawrocki are attached in **Exhibit A**.

16. A paraprofessional, Asef “Ricky” Dyer, was used when feasible. Mr. Dyer is an experienced litigation support professional who has provided trial and graphics supports at

approximately 100 trials during his career. Mr. Dyer created the demonstrative graphics, built the trial case database, organized exhibits, and oversaw the presentation of exhibits at trial.

17. The table below summarizes the rates sought for the attorneys and paraprofessional who worked on this case, the hours billed by each timekeeper, and the amount actually sought for each timekeeper. The rates listed for the partners and the paraprofessional below are lower than their standard billing rates, in some cases significantly so. The rates listed for the associates are their standard billing rates as set by Firm management on the basis of experience and performance.

18. In addition to the statement for services rendered, a number of costs and expenses have been reasonably incurred on behalf of Mr. Correll, for which we also seek reimbursement. **Exhibit C** lists all of the costs and expenses that were paid over the course of the litigation for which reimbursement is sought. The total expenses incurred are \$6,740.26.

19. The total of fees and costs requested by this fee petition is \$247,571.51. It is my belief that our request is reasonable for the work done, both in terms of the rates charged and the tasks that had to be undertaken.

20. In light of the foregoing, it is my opinion that the fees sought in Mr. Correll's Fee Petition, and the hours and rates on which they are based, as well as the costs sought in the Fee Petition, were both reasonable and necessary to the representation of our client in the case.
