Based upon the Declaratory Decree, Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law entered of record March 24, 2008, it is ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Third Amended Complaint seeking injunctive relief and a declaratory judgment of the constitutionality of Florida Statute Section 97.055 be, and the same is hereby DENIED and DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE.

1. Judgment is herewith entered on behalf of Kurt S. Browning, Secretary of State of Florida, against the Plaintiffs American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations; American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO; Florida Public Employees Council 79, AFSCME, AFL-CIO; and Service Employees International Union.  
Plaintiffs shall take nothing from this action and go hence without day;
2. Any and all remaining pending motions unresolved by the Declaratory Decree, Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law entered the 25th day of March, 2008 (D.E. #338) are DENIED AS MOOT.
3. The Court reserves jurisdiction to enter a separate judgment for costs and attorney's fees to the Defendant as the prevailing party upon application in accordance with the rules of Court.
